

Engagement Opportunities:

Housing Allocations Policy Update

This spring and summer, staff are inviting Squamish People to share their feedback on the Housing Allocations Policy. Staff are working to increase the clarity, transparency, and consistency of the policy and process.

The update will include:

- Improving the clarity of the eligibility requirements
- Making the definitions clearer
- Simplifying the policy language
- Addressing and removing any contradictions
- Ensuring Squamish Nation staff procedures in the policy are consistent

The update will not be:

- Specifying how many homes are allocated or distributed between categories
- Determining the number of allocations that are made in any given year
- Creating new categories or changing existing category headings

To update our Allocations Policy and process, we are launching Round 1 of engagement to understand what clarity, transparency, and consistency mean for our community. 

ABOUT THE CAPILANO SUBSTATION

Capilano Substation, located at Woods Dr and Pemberton Ave, was built in the 1950s and serves approximately 12,000 customers in the area. BC Hydro is upgrading the facility by replacing it with a new substation to ensure that reliable electricity can continue to be provided in North Vancouver. As part of the upgrade work, two metal banners to be created by a Squamish Nation artist will be installed along the substation exterior.

SQUAMISH NATION PUBLIC ART OPPORTUNITY

This call is for a Squamish Nation artist or artist team to design and create two metal banners reflective of Coast Salish design and imagery at the Capilano Substation. The metal banners are to be installed on the main substation sign (left image) and continue along the north-west corner of the substation (right image, blue). Shortlisted artists will also be invited to design and develop vinyl wrap to be installed on six aluminum panels (right image, red) facing Murdo Frazer Park.



GUIDING PRINCIPLES FOR SQUAMISH NATION PUBLIC ART OPPORTUNITY

To celebrate, recognize, and give space to the Squamish Nation to represent their traditional territory; and

six aluminum panels for optional wraps (red)

 To display a legacy of Squamish heritage and culture while acknowledging the BC Hydro relationship and working towards reconciliation.

TECHNICAL CRITERIA AND SPECIFICATIONS

- See page 2 for approx. dimensions (final dimensions to be confirmed with artist);
- Have a life expectancy of at least 25 years;
- Be structurally sound and durable to the elements; and
- Not present a hazard or opportunity for injury.
- Use Coast Salish designs only (No Northwest coast designs)

BUDGET

The total contract value is \$40,000 with an optional contract extension of \$10,000 for vinyl graphic wraps. The budget is exclusive of GST and inclusive of all the costs listed under the Artist Responsibilities.

ARTIST RESPONSIBILITIES

The selected artist will be responsible for (with the provided budget, as appropriate):

- Meeting all submission deadlines and milestones for the project
- Artist fee (research, concept development, renderings and other visual communication materials, presentation, project meetings and coordination with Project Co)
- Prototyping

- Artwork materials and fabrication
- Consultant and engineering fees and stamped drawings (artwork only)
- Shipping to station or designated storage site

- On site supervision during installation
- Professional photographic documentation
- Administrative expenses, travel expenses, and maintenance manual expenses
- 15% contingencies (recommended; will be applied to the artwork if not used)

ELIGIBILITY

This public art call has been prepared to solicit responses specifically from Squamish Nation artists who can demonstrate the creative expertise and technical skills required to manage all phases of the public art process, from design development to installation. Further artistic considerations include reflecting Squamish Nation.

ARTIST SELECTION-2 STEP PROCESS

The selection process will be a two-stage, limited open call to Squamish Nation artists:

- 1. An expression of interest inviting artists or artist teams to submit a short project proposal with qualifications and examples of past work; and
- 2. An interview process inviting shortlisted applicants to present their proposal. Shortlisted applicants will also be invited to submit an optional proposal for a vinyl wrap concept design.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Artists or artist teams interested in either opportunity must prepare and submit an electronic application in one (1) pdf file no larger than 10 MB. Please include the following in the submission:


