- Declaration week will be <u>December 2-6, 2024</u>, you can do your declaration at Income Assistance office OR on December 5th at Distribution (DB) locations, please look for Income Assistance staff.
- Dec 6th Eslha7an/IA office will be closed for mandatory staff meeting. Declarations will be accepted through the mail slot between 11am and 1pm.
- Clients that receive direct deposit will receive their benefits on December 30, 2024
- All clients and landlords that receive cheques, they will be delivered on December 30, 2024. <u>Please ensure you're home</u> to receive and accept your cheque.
- Squamish Nation offices are closed for Christmas Holidays from Dec 20, 2024 to Jan 1, 2025.
- IF YOU ARE NOT HOME to receive your Income Assistance benefits or rent you will be able to pick up your cheque at the office January 2, 2025 when Nation offices open.

NEW Woodwork Training Program

The Woodwork Training Program running from October 28 - December 19, has given students the opportunity to gain a unique set of skills and work on a legacy project.

The students are learning how to safely and correctly use the following machines:

- Table saw used for cutting across and with the wood grain
- Band saw used to cut both wood and metal stock
- Jointer used for flattening on face of a board/wood
- Planer used to mill a board to a uniform thickness from rough-cut lumber
- Plus many more!

After learning how to use the above tools, students put their knowledge to the test by making their own charcuterie boards.

In the final weeks of the program, students will embark on their legacy project: crafting the trays on which the medals will be presented for the 2025 Invictus Games.


